A successful candidate for the QKF AAA Girls Provincial Tournament scholarship will exhibit the following, in addition to the above:

In the game of basketball:

- Dedication to team success as an over-arching goal
- Offensive skill with an appreciation for both team scoring and individual contribution
- Defensive perseverance and commitment
- Relentless pursuit of possession of the ball
 - Makes the players around her better
 - Demonstrates strong leadership behaviours on the court
- The demonstration of these qualities in Tournament play.

In her personal life:

- Good sportsmanship represented by respect for her teammates, coaches, game officials and opponents;
- Character, leadership and determination in personal endeavours, academic pursuits and community involvement.

The scholarship is awarded to a graduating player and is conditional on the honouree enrolling in a post-secondary educational institution approved by the Foundation.
